

Coronavirus Update

Date - 10th January 2022

NEPAL

Nepal's coronavirus caseload reached 832,589 with 841 more persons testing positive in the last 24 hours. Amid the rapid surge in coronavirus cases across the globe, the Nepal government has decided to make 'vaccination cards'— the proof of COVID-19 inoculation, mandatory for entry into public spaces such as government offices, hotels, cinema halls, among other places from January 17.

Vaccination all over Nepal is going on full swing and as of today 48.5% vaccinated at least one dose and 35.9% of total population is fully vaccinated.

Clients who have been fully vaccinated are not required to follow any quarantine restrictions. VISA on arrival has been resumed for the convenience of passengers. For fully immunized visitors, all tourist attractions are open.

Travelers arriving from African Continental and via Hongkong are not allowed to enter Nepal.

Kathmandu has relaxed the health protocol for arrivals with effect from 04th January 2022. Here's the <u>link</u> newly updated health and safety guidelines implemented by the government.

Things to remember before travelling:

- > 72 Hrs. prior RTPCR negative report.
- Fully Vaccinated.
- ➤ Need to fill up the CCMC form before arriving to Nepal as they have to show the print to get Visa on Arrival.
