

Coronavirus Update

Date - 03rd June 2021

SRI LANKA

In the last three weeks, the country has seen an all-time high in coronavirus infection cases on a daily basis. Government has imposed an island wide lockdown until 07th June.

On the 21st of May, the Sri Lankan government announced a 10-day suspension of all inbound international passenger flights as part of its efforts to contain the pandemic on the island nation. In the midst of the current COVID-19 shutdown, the government reopened its international airport for passengers on June 1st, bringing the situation back to where it was before May 21st, with 75 passengers per aircraft allowed.

However, those with a travel record to India and Vietnam over the last 14 days would not be allowed to disembark at the Colombo airport.

The coronavirus case count in Srilanka now stands as follows according to latest health ministry figures.
