

Coronavirus Update

Date – 8th April 2021

SRI LANKA

In Sri Lanka, daily cases are - by contrast - coming down after a peak in mid-February.

The country started vaccinating its population in late January and is in process to order 0.7 Million doses of the Russian Sputnik V vaccine.

The coronavirus case count in Srilanka now stands as follows according to latest health ministry figures.

As per the latest protocol, clients will be divided into two categories: vaccinated and non-vaccinated.

- The vaccinated clients will need to have both doses and the second dose should be taken at least 14 days prior to arriving to Sri Lanka, once they enter the country, they will need to stay in a Level 1 property only for one night and have an on arrival PCR test and if the PRC test is negative, they can move out of the bio-bubble and tour freely.
- The non-vaccinated clients also get divided into two categories, the clients staying less than 14 days and clients staying over 14 days.

a.) The clients staying less than 14 days, will have to undergo PCR testing on arrival and the day before they leave.

b.) The clients staying over 14 days will have to undergo PCR testing on arrival and again on day 13 and after which they can move out

of the bubble and tour freely.

Government has taken measures to review the quarantine process and to reduce the number of quarantine days for travelers who have received the coronavirus vaccine. This is still on process and hopefully we will have a positive update in the regard over coming days.
